JE has obtained a quote to address all the issues which involve replacing the chains and seats on the swings and to repair the carousel seat. JE to ask Groomed Gardens to distribute more bark chippings in bare areas. JE to attend to black plastic pads and any dangerous wooden strips around the playground. A £700 spend was agreed. IP **Hedge on Back Lane** IP has been unable to contact Ryde Farm Estate so has made contact with a new contact at Savills who act on behalf of RFE and have had no response other than to say that no hedges will be cut until 1st September. Mary Leech said that the hedge has not been cut in over 15 years and it needs addressing as well as the ditch being overgrown and prone to flooding. IP to approach Philip Kirk of Savills in 4-6 weeks and review. If no success a formal letter will need to be sent. DT **Concurrent Function Grants 2021/22** Various ideas were discussed as possible projects fulfilling the criteria of applying for a grant from GBC for 2021/22. The meeting agreed that the installation of Bollards at the entrance to Green Lane aka Bridleway 68 to restrict vehicular access and hence curtail regular vehicular fly tipping which recently included a dead horse. The project was estimated to cost £1200 and DT to complete application and submit to GBC before the 7<sup>th</sup> September deadline. JE to try and establish contact with the landowner believed to be Ryde Farm JE Estates.

#### 20/47 Issues with Clandon Manor Farm

There are a number of issues arising which require attention by the owners of Clandon Manor Farm, however, ECPC have sent registered letters, the most recent in February 2020 to the owners at an address in Cobham and have received no replies. The issues are ongoing and are:

- 1) Snelgate/Epsom Road boundary and Back Lane hedge row maintenance and Elm tree maintenance
- 2) Ragwort growing in the land adjoining and owned by Clandon Manor Farm
- 3) Injurious weeds under the Weeds Act i.e. thistles on the land adjoining CMF

ECPC to try and make contact through the account manager for CMF at Savills to see if they can pass a letter from ECPC detailing the issues on our behalf. DT to contact SALC to find out what legal representation we are entitled to as a Parish Council in such matters.
